## DRIVE-THRU SHREDDING EVENT

SATURDAY, MARCH 5 | 9 A.M. - NOON  
ROSENBERG CITY HALL | 2110 4TH ST.

This event is **FREE** and **open to Rosenberg residents**. Residents must show proof of residency onsite or pick up a fast pass ahead of time from Citizens Relations at City Hall by Friday, March 4 at 5 p.m. **NEW: Only EIGHT (8) boxes will be shredded per vehicle at one time. You can shred more than eight (8) boxes in total, but you must re-enter the line.**

This is a **contactless, drive-thru event**. You must stay in your vehicle. Onsite personnel will remove documents from vehicles for secure onsite shredding and recycling.

## GRASS CLIPPINGS DON'T BELONG IN THE STREET OR DOWN THE STORM DRAIN

Do not sweep or blow yard clippings and leaves in the street or down the storm drains which lead straight into our local waterways. While these clippings are natural, they still pollute our waterways. As yard waste decomposes, it requires oxygen — oxygen that fish and other aquatic life need to survive. Grass clippings left on the lawn return valuable nutrients to the soil. It's a win for your yard and the environment.
