Signs, Signs, Everywhere Signs

Did you know that Article XV, Sec 1-362 of the Development Code outlines rules and regulations for signs? Several to remember are:

- It is unlawful for any person to place a sign on any public building or property including, but not limited to: streets, sidewalks, curbs, gutters, trees, utility poles, signal lights or posts within the City.
- Commercial business properties can only have one freestanding sign every 250 feet of street frontage.
- Signs and illuminated signs cannot interfere or obstruct traffic signs, signals or devices.
- Off-premise and bandit-type signs are prohibited by ordinance.
- Temporary signs such as garage sale signs and real estate signs are allowed on the private property and must be removed within 48 hours after the date of the event or to which signs are relevant.
- Political signs cannot be in place more than 90 days prior to an election and must be removed within 10 days after an election.

DON'T BELONG IN THE STREET OR DOWN THE STORM DRAIN

Do not sweep or blow yard clippings and leaves in the street or down the storm drains which lead straight into our local waterways. While these clippings are natural, they still pollute our waterways. As yard waste decomposes, it requires oxygen — oxygen that fish and other aquatic life need to survive. Grass clippings left on the lawn return valuable nutrients to the soil. It's a win for your yard and the environment.
