

Boards, Commissions, Committees and Task Force Positions Open **Calling all volunteers! Here's your chance to make a difference in #Rtown!**

The City is seeking applications for citizens eager to contribute to various boards, commissions, committees and task forces. These volunteer roles play a crucial part in city governance, offering invaluable perspectives and guidance on a range of municipal matters and activities.

Positions currently open include:

- **Building and Standards Board (5 positions)**
 - Must include one active building contractor, one licensed master electrician, one licensed master plumber, a licensed mechanical contractor, and one representative from the city at large.
- **Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) Evaluation Committee (4 positions)**
 - Must be a resident of the city or owner of a business located in the city
- **Image Committee (7 positions)**
 - Must be a resident of the city or owner of property or a business located in the city
- **Parks and Recreation Board (7-13 positions)**
 - Must be a resident of the city or owner of property or a business located in the city
- **Planning Commission (7 positions)**
 - Must be a resident of the city but may not serve on any other board, committee, commission or task force other than a temporary special task force or temporary committee
- **Rosenberg Development Corporation (RDC) Board (2 positions)**
 - Must be a resident of the City
- **Water/Wastewater Impact Fee Advisory Task Force (1 position)**
 - ETJ Citizen Rep (must reside in the ETJ and not corporate city limits)

Rosenberg Adopts 2023 National Electrical Code

At the City Council Meeting held on Tuesday, April 2, 2024, Rosenberg City Council passed ordinance No. 2024-14, which amends the Unified Development Code of the City of Rosenberg by adopting the 2023 National Electrical Code.

Effective September 1, 2023, the State of Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) officially adopted the 2023 National Electrical Code as the minimum standard for all electrical work in Texas. The National Electrical Code provides a national standard for electrical installations associated with residential, commercial, and industrial buildings and structures. The current local code exceptions for Rosenberg located in the UDC, Chapter 1, Sections 1-127 through 1-135, will remain in effect.

FIGHT the BITE

Don't give mosquitoes a biting chance!

The City is now spraying weekly to help control the mosquito population!
Here's how you can help! Use the 4-D's:

- **Drain** any standing water in your yard - Mosquitoes love to breed in stagnant water. This includes pools, broken flower pots or other open containers, clogged rain gutters, and birdbaths.
- **Dress** in long sleeves and pants if you are outside and mosquitoes are active. For extra protection, spray clothing and exposed body areas with repellent.
- **Dusk/Dawn** is when mosquitoes are most active. Try your best to stay indoors! If going out, use repellent.
- **DEET** (n,n-diethyl-m-toluamide) is an ingredient to look for in your insect repellent. Other acceptable repellents contain Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus or Picaridin. Also consider using appropriate sprays for your yard. Always wear repellent when you are outside and follow label instructions; do not allow children to apply their own repellent.

Economic Development Strategic Plan Approved

On April 2, 2024, the Rosenberg City Council unanimously approved and ratified the adoption of the Economic Development Strategic Plan 2024-2033 (Plan), initially approved by the RDC Board on March 13, 2024. The Plan represents several months of extensive information gathering and detailed analysis by Economic Development staff and TIP Strategies, Inc., a firm specializing in professional strategic planning services. The Plan is intended to guide the RDC and the Economic Development Department to prioritize new projects and build a deeper knowledge base to expand staff roles, offering greater benefits to new and existing businesses in Rosenberg and strengthening partnerships with public and private entities regionally.

The Plan consists of an in-depth quantitative analysis that prepared a target assessment of factors that define the area's overall competitiveness and concerns to economic decision-makers (e.g., sales tax, tax, base, housing, business climate), workforce analysis, and land use analysis. This data, along with the information gathered during stakeholder engagement, generated an analysis of Rosenberg's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT).

Working closely with the RDC staff and the RDC Board of Directors to identify and refine strategic direction, TIP Strategies drew on insights from the qualitative and quantitative research to create the plan framework. The strategic plan seeks to maximize development opportunities in three areas including industrial, retail and redevelopment. The organizational goals focus on compliance and market data, public communications and transparency, workforce development, and small business and entrepreneurship.
