Green waste and vegetative debris pick-up continues and is expected to take several weeks to complete.

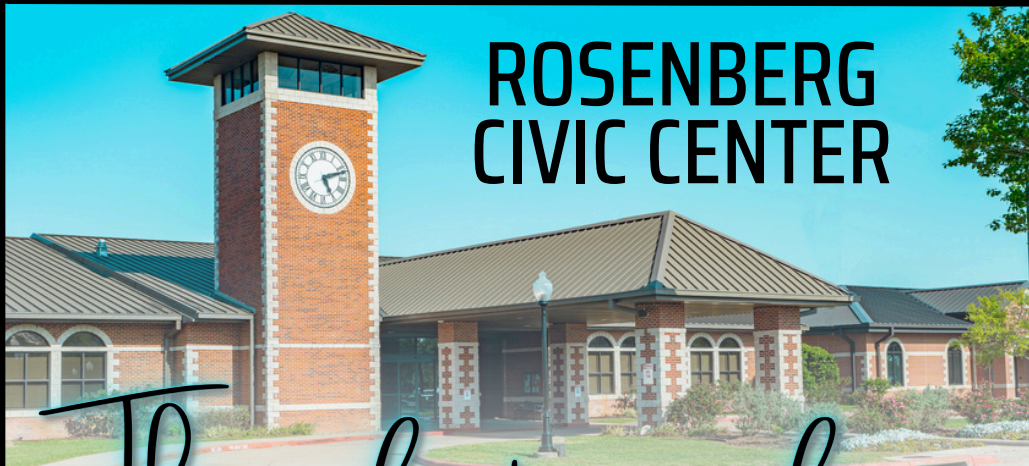


**Pitch, Hit, Run**

**TIPS FOR DRIVERS**

- Obey school zone speed limits.
- Stop and yield for people in crosswalks.
- Stay alert and put your phone away.
- Watch for kids darting into the street or between vehicles.
- Stop for school bus stop signs or flashing red lights.

**TIPS FOR CHILDREN**

- Look left-right-left before stepping into the street.
- Use crosswalks and obey crossing guards.
- Don't use your phone when you're walking.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Always wear a helmet when riding a bike.

# ROSENBERG DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

## LET'S TALK BUSINESS INCENTIVES:

The Rosenberg Development Corporation (RDC) was created by election in 1995 as a Type-B economic development corporation funded by a one-half cent sales tax. State law authorizes the RDC and the City to engage in projects related to primary job creation and offer incentive packages based on several factors. Primary jobs are jobs that infuse new dollars into the local economy by creating or selling a product or service that is ultimately exported to regional, state, national, or international markets. Incentive packages are offered on a case-by-case basis to attract businesses to the community that generate these jobs and capital investment.

The City of Rosenberg and RDC offer incentives dependent upon commitments for the number of jobs, duration of operation, and size of investment of a particular project. The RDC has utilized its ability to offer economic development incentives and construct new infrastructure to recruit and retain a number of companies.

Eligible projects include:

- Manufacturing, industrial, research and development, recycling, warehouse, and/or corporate headquarters
- Job training
- Infrastructure for expanded business and commerce
- Business-related water, sewer and site improvements
- Projects that improve Rosenberg's quality of life, including parks, professional and amateur sports and athletic facilities, tourism and entertainment facilities, affordable housing and other improvements or expenditures that promote new or expanded business activity that create or retain primary jobs

The RDC is also accepting applications for its Business Improvement Grant. The Business Improvement Grant program is designed to enhance the economic vitality of the City by encouraging visually appealing exterior physical improvements to local businesses. Any new or existing business in the City limits is eligible to apply for grant funding for reimbursement on projects that improve the physical appearance of its business facility. Up to 50% of the total project cost, up to \$10,000 is available to qualifying projects.
