Quick Facts about Soliciting!

Ordinance No. 2025-32, adopting updated rules and regulations for itinerant vendors, solicitors and peddlers.

What Rosenberg Residents Should Know:

The City of Rosenberg has updated its rules for door-to-door solicitation to help protect residents and ensure responsible business practices. Below is a quick guide to what homeowners need to know.

- Solicitors must have a valid City permit to sell products or services door-to-door.
- Companies are responsible for ensuring their solicitors follow City rules.
- Residents may prohibit soliciting by posting a weatherproof "NO SOLICITORS" sign near the front door.
- Permitted between the hours of 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. - Monday through Saturday.
- NOT permitted on Sundays.
- Solicitation is not allowed on major holidays: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Presidents Day, Memorial Day, Juneteenth Day (June 19th), Independence Day (July 4th), Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
- Solicitors must leave immediately if a resident asks them to.
- Violations may result in fines up to \$500 per incident.
- Political, religious and certain charitable visits are permit-exempt under First Amendment protections.
- Soliciting on city-owned property (streets, sidewalks, rights-of-way) is prohibited without written approval.
- Solicitors must carry and show their City-issued permit upon request.

COUNCIL CORNER:

Council highlights for the month of November

Council considered and approved several important action items, including:

- Resolution No. R-3973, A grant application funding to install bullet-resistant components on law enforcement vehicles.
- Resolution No. R-3980, Updates to the City's Fee Schedule for home solicitation activities, adding a \$250 quarterly registration fee and a \$50 duplicate badge fee.
- Resolution No. R-3977, Authorization for Animal Control and Shelter to seek and accept a \$100,000 grant for its Lifesaving Safety Net Program.
- City Council approved installation of two speed humps on Millie Street to improve neighborhood safety.
- City Council approved 10' Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) funding agreements to support tourism, marketing, arts and community programs.

Christmas Trees and all other green waste are made into mulch or compost. **DO NOT** dump your Christmas Tree in the City's parks. This is illegal dumping and you could be fined.

Economic Development is the engine that drives community prosperity by fostering wealth creation, enhancing quality of life and supporting business growth. These efforts generate new jobs, attract investments and expand the tax base. These business recruitment and expansion efforts have created nearly 450 jobs and over \$308 Million of taxable value (that's over 6% of total taxable property value in the City!). This generates over \$13 Million dollars annually for the City's General Fund which is responsible for providing our residents with basic city services like fire, police, animal control, streets and drainage and parks and recreation. By focusing economic development efforts on generating new commercial value in the city, the financial burden for these services can be off-set from residential taxpayers, creating balance between commercial and residential tax revenue that fund the City's core services.
