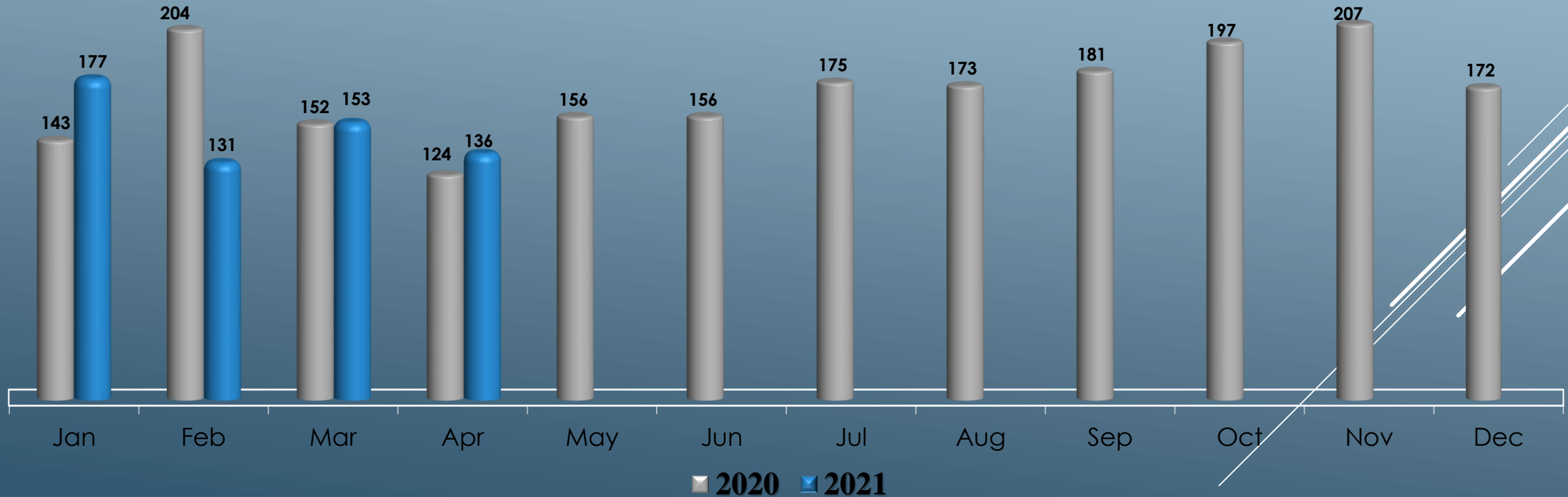

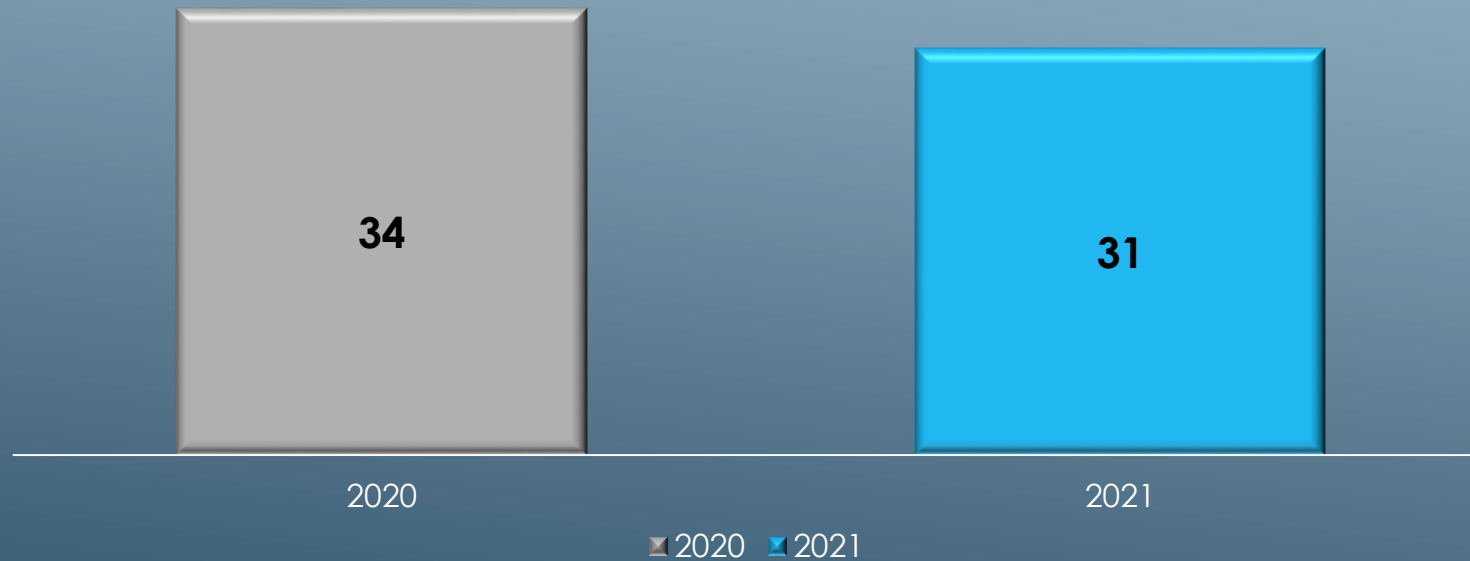
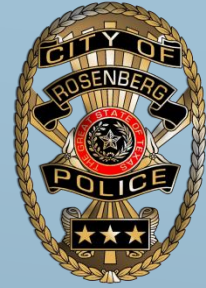

April 2020 vs April 2021

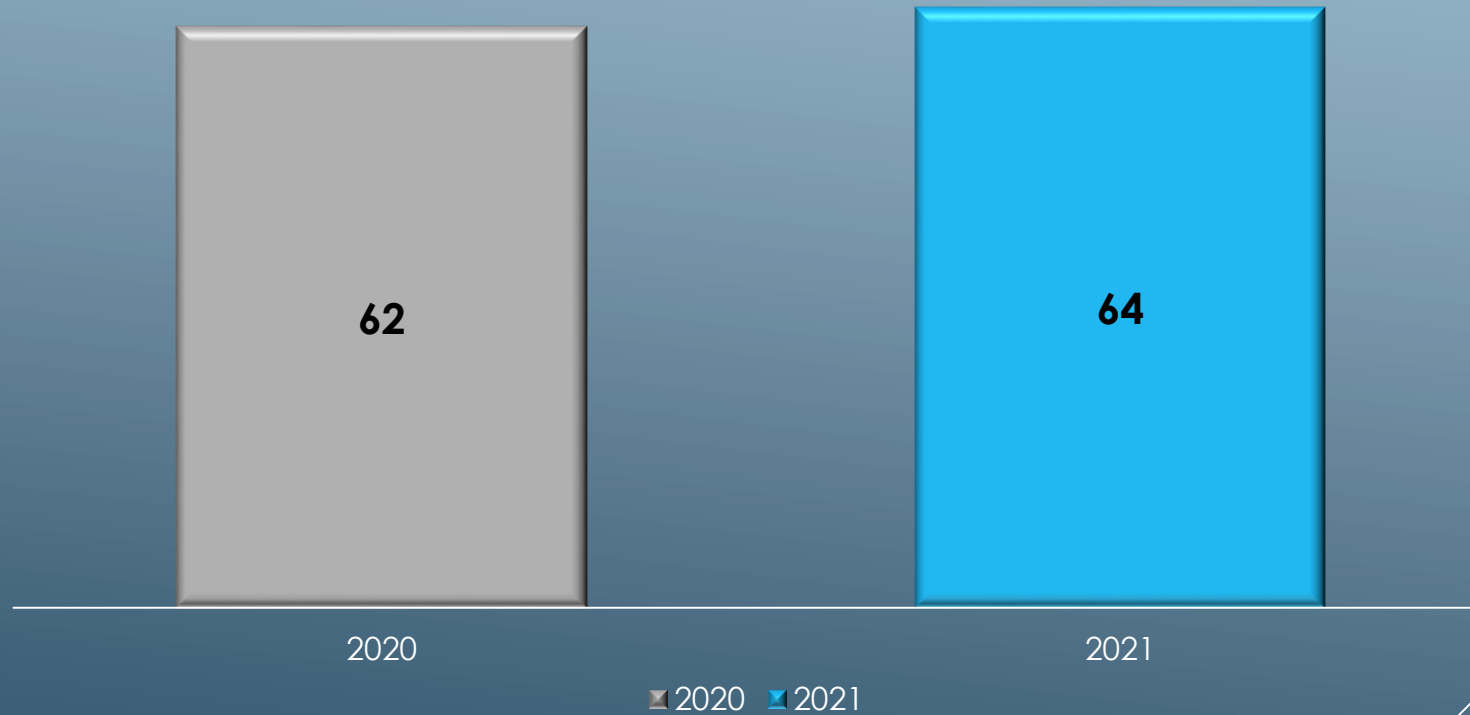

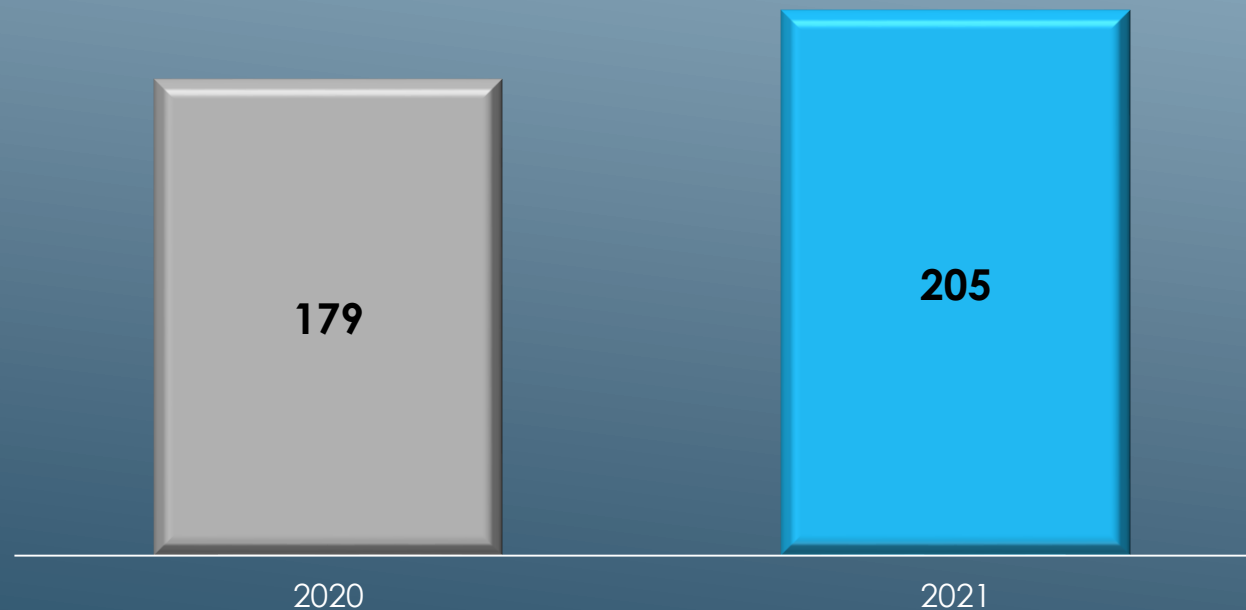

Total for 2021 = 297

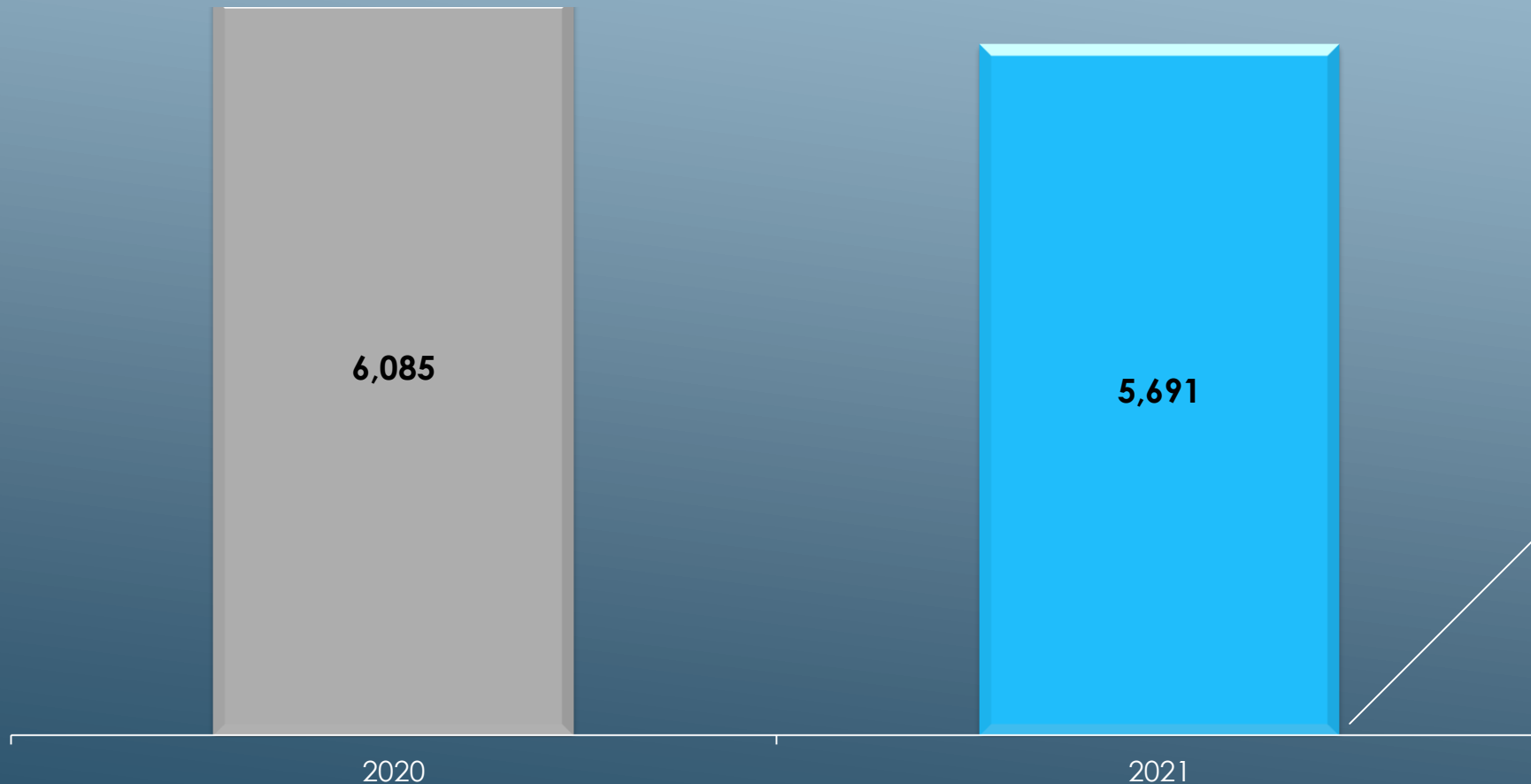


COMMUNICATIONS DIVISION

EMPLOYEES OF THE WEEK

- **Week of April 3rd** - Detective Joseph Rogers was selected for assisting on-duty patrol officers apprehend a subject wanted on felony charges. Detective Rogers was working an extra job at the time of action and immediately left his secondary employment to assist with the apprehension while off duty.
- **Week of April 9th** - TCO Vikki Collins was selected for her diligence and calmness while operating the radio in emergency conditions involving a foot pursuit and coordination within the dispatch center amongst many radio channels.
- **Week of April 16th** – Officer Roddy Harris was selected for his investigation into a suspicious vehicle which was later found to have been stolen in the City of Houston. The occupants were said to have been armed and dangerous. Officer Harris appropriately and safely apprehended the occupants of the vehicle likely preventing an additional crime in Rosenberg.
- **Week of April 23rd** – TCO Brittany Perry received an emergency call from a female which was locked in her bedroom and fearful due to threats from her husband. TCO Perry remained on the phone with the caller until officers arrived and provided compassionate dialogue with the victim, ultimately handling the crisis exceptionally well.



EMPLOYEES OF THE WEEK CONT'D

- **Week of April 30th** – Officer George Vela was selected for his professionalism and persistence while investigating a weapons disturbance at an apartment complex. Officer Vela's investigation led to the arrest of one individual illegally possessing an AK-47 rifle and one individual illegally possessing a handgun. Officer Vela's investigation likely prevented a violent encounter from occurring.
