

RESOLUTION NO. R-2936

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSENBERG, TEXAS, EXTENDING THE DISASTER DECLARATION ISSUED BY MAYORAL PROCLAMATION ON MARCH 18, 2020, AND EXTENDED BY CITY COUNCIL ON APRIL 7, 2020, WITH THE APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2935, SCHEDULED TO EXPIRE AT 11:59 P.M. CENTRAL TIME ON APRIL 21, 2020, IN RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 VIRUS PANDEMIC, PURSUANT TO SECTION 418.108 OF THE TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE.

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, the City of Rosenberg, Fort Bend County, Texas, issued a mayoral proclamation declaring a state of disaster for the City of Rosenberg, Texas, in response to the anticipated loss of life and damage to property threatened by conditions resulting from the COVID-19 virus pandemic; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 418.108(b), Texas Government Code, a local state of disaster may not be continued for a period of excess of seven (7) days without the consent of the governmental body of the political subdivision; and

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, the City Council extended the disaster declaration to 7:00 p.m. Central Time on April 7, 2020, with the approval of Resolution No. R-2930; and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2020, the City Council further extended the disaster declaration to 11:59 p.m. Central Time on April 21, 2020, with the approval of Resolution No. R-2935; and

WHEREAS, the conditions necessitating such disaster declaration continue to exist; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect the public health and safety; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSENBERG:

Section 1. The declaration of disaster, which was signed and executed by the Mayor on March 18, 2020, and extended by City Council action until 11:59 p.m. Central Time on April 21, 2020, shall be renewed and continued through 11:59 p.m. Central Time on May 5, 2020, in accordance with Section 418.108 of the Texas Government Code.

Section 2. That City Council will further review said extension of the declaration of disaster prior to the expiration date, and shall make a determination if conditions have improved or if the threat to public health from the COVID-19 virus pandemic still exists, and take action as may be appropriate to terminate or extend the declaration of disaster for an additional period, not to exceed thirty (30) days.

Section 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and approval.
